Gayle Bina and Jody Freeman were thanked for the festive Valentine atmosphere. Lunch was distributed as various items were presented and discussed:

Tournament opportunities:

Dawn Cordo presented information about the **Skidaway Audubon Golf Event** and fund raiser. It will be held on May 11, at the P courses and is a scramble. It is \$145 per player. There are many raffle prizes and proceeds will benefit the Monarch Butterfly Trail. Flyers with contact information were distributed.

? -The grand prize of \$10,000 for a Hole in One is given by a commercial company based in PA.

Yvonne DuRoss presented information about the **Landlovers Charitable Raffle – to play in the Pro-Am 18 hole scramble with 2 Korn Ferry Pros.** \$150 a ticket that includes many additional experiences and gifts. The proceeds benefit the Scholarship and Grand Fund. Cards with contact information were distributed.

L9 business:

2019 Most Improved Player - Cynthia King was recognized as the 2019 Most Improved Player. Cynthia received a certificate and a sleeve of golf balls.

L9 website -Jill Rubin assisted to demonstrate the ease of signing up for play and canceling. The ability to view the player list is available -allowing players to encourage friends who have not yet signed up.

-Susan Painter (pairings coordinator) noted that sign-up and changes may be made until the morning of Monday before Thursday play. If there is a need to cancel after that time, players should contact the pairings coordinator. Decisions to not play on Thursday should be called into the pro-shop.

GHIN - Golfers were reminded to carefully review and select the correct options –For L9 play – remember to choose 9 hole play and tees played.

The Member-Guest Tournament: *Wild About Golf* Play is on March 18 (scramble) and 19 (Best Ball followed by lunch). Cost is \$70 per pair and guests must have a handicap but need not be Landings Club Members. More information regarding the on-line sign-up was requested.

Scoring - Kimberly Greenlaw presented L9's effort to ease the job of Scorers. Captain jobs- turn in **one** attested card with 2 signatures under the correct flight cube **AND** write the team or individual scores on the tee sheet.

This process allows the scorer to review the scores written on the tee-sheet and alleviates the need to review many individual cards. Only the top two scores need to be considered for points awarded.

A guideline book has been created for all scorers. During sign-in and after play a sample of a completed scoring card is available for review. Peggy Miller was recognized for her fine work of creating sample score cards that are posted on the web site.

A printed copy of the responsibilities for Captains will also be at the table.

There was a question regarding the process of captain selection as this job is not always rotated. At present the first player of the team (the A player generated by data) is the designated captain. Different thoughts were discussed to rotate this job more frequently. At this time, golfers were asked to maintain procedures outlined in the handbook. If a captain is new or cannot play, the captain should seek the assistance of another team player. The Board will consider this item for the 2021 year.
