Etiquette and Other Niceties

- 1. Arrive in plenty of time to check in. Given the size of our weekly group, it takes time to get everyone checked in. Therefore, check-in time takes place from 8:15AM-8:45AM. (During January and February it is 9:15AM-9:45AM). This allows the check-in coordinator to complete check-in tasks and still be able to gather with the group for our Pro Tip time.
- 2. Cancel if you unable to play. If you know before tee times are issued, go back to the event registration page and remove yourself. If after tee times are issued, contact the captain (first person listed in your foursome), the check-in person, and the ProShop.
- 3. If you are the captain (first person listed in your foursome), contact the others in your foursome to determine who will have carts and who will ride with whom. Only two carts are allowed per foursome.
- 4. Do not walk in players "line of play" on the green.
- 5. Do not stand where you might distract a fellow player and don't move while they are hitting.
- 6. Respect Pace of Play. Under normal circumstances, a round of 9 holes should not exceed two hours and fifteen minutes.

- 7. Quiet Please! No talking while others are hitting. Please silence your phone.
- 8. Place an identifying mark on your ball.
- 9. Leave the course in better shape than you found it! Rake traps, fix divots and ball marks.
- 10. Dress appropriately...easy to do with four great Pro Shops!
