The plans are for a complete overhaul like Palmetto, but most important is to fix the drainage. Bill Bergin has been selected after an extensive review of 18 proposals. He plans to lower the height of the greens which have increased from the original design due to 40 years of top dressing, sand, general course maintenance. Terrapin Point is planned for a rework three years from now, budget permitting. Dean took questions from the audience including discussing how the club budgets for capital items and how rising insurance rates are affecting everyone and everything.
